Patron of the university

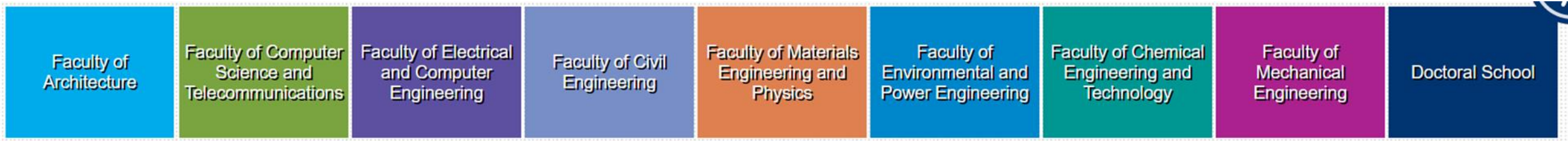
- **Tadeusz Kościuszko (1746 –1817)**
- The Polish **military engineer**, statesman, and military leader who became a **national hero in Poland** and the United States
- He fought in the Polish–Lithuanian Commonwealth's struggles against Russia and Prussia, and **on the US side in the American Revolutionary War**
- A close friend of Thomas Jefferson's, with whom he shared ideals of human rights
- As Supreme Commander of the Polish National Armed Forces, he led the 1794 **Kościuszko Uprising**

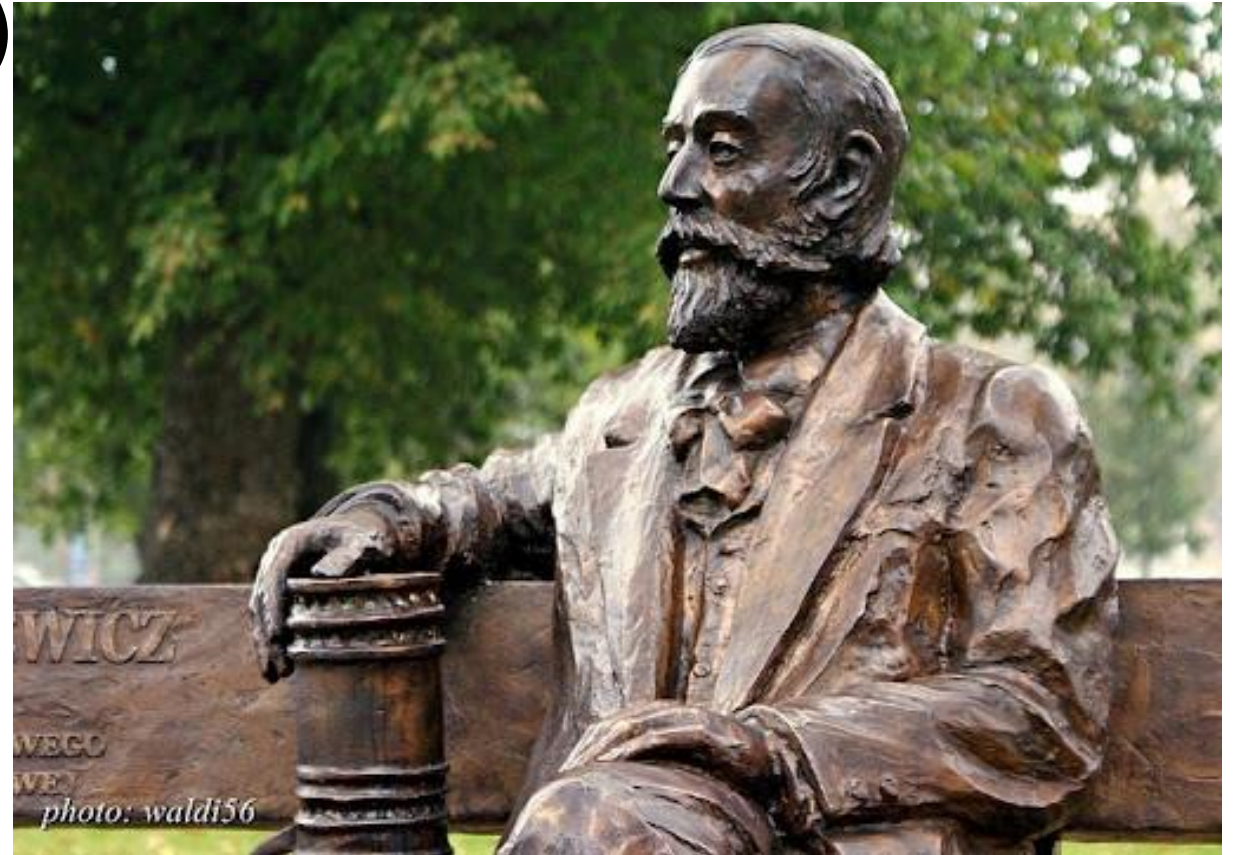

Patron of the university

- **Ignacy Łukasiewicz (1822 –1882)**
- The Polish pharmacist, engineer, businessman, inventor and philanthropist
- He was a pioneer who in 1856 built **the world's first modern oil refinery**
- His achievements included:
 - the invention of **the modern kerosene lamp** (1853),
 - the introduction of **the first modern street lamp** in Europe (1853),
 - the construction of the world's first modern oil well (1854).

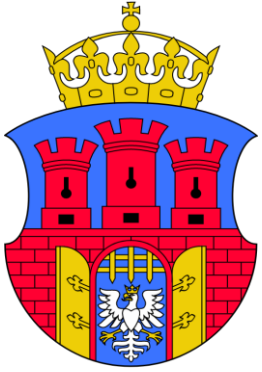

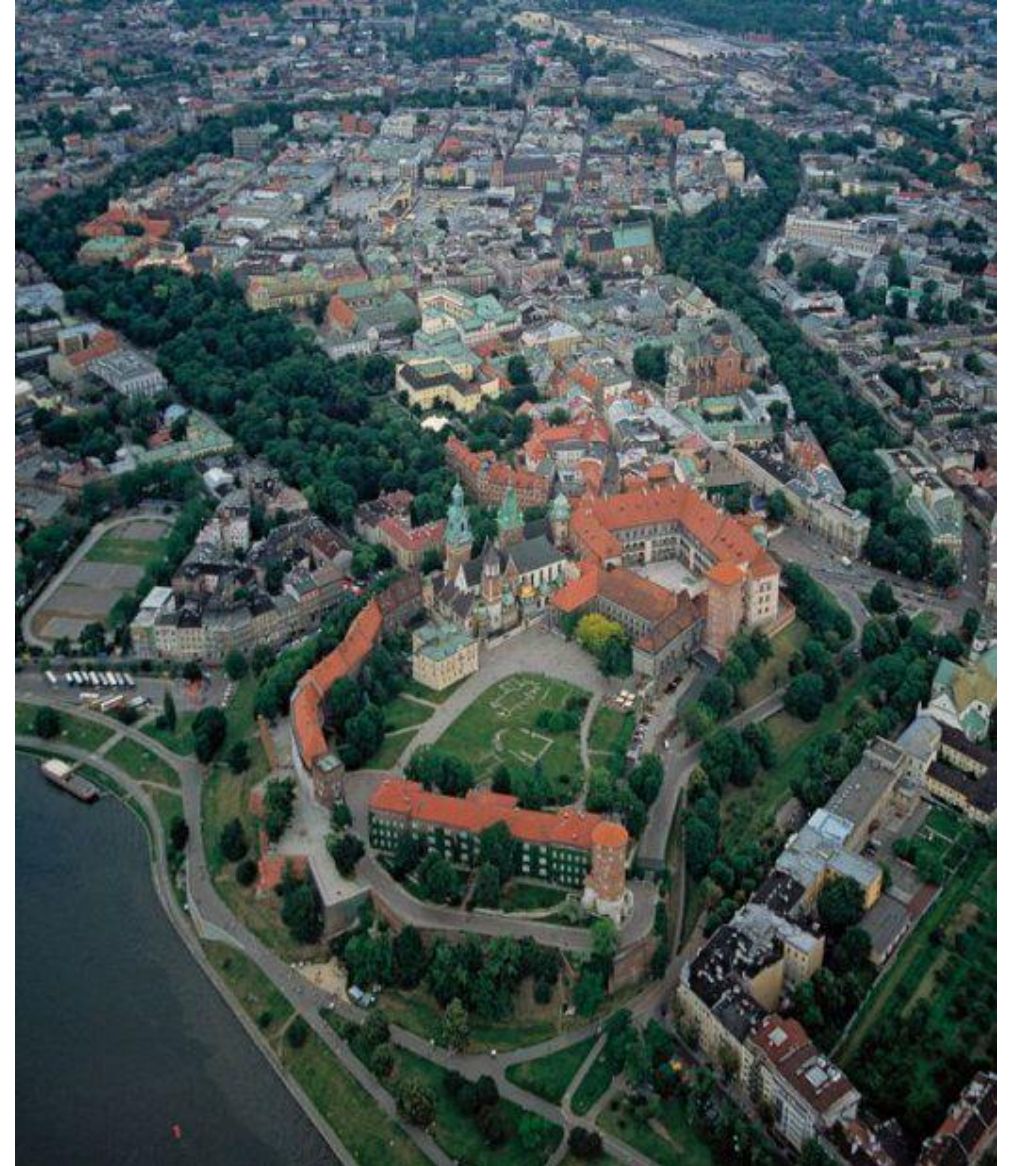

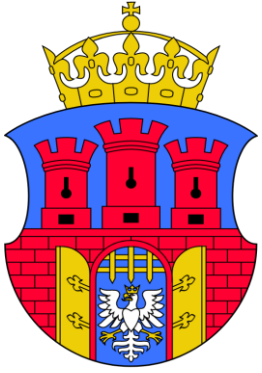




About Cracow

- Cracow is **the second-largest** and one of the oldest cities in Poland.
- Situated on **the Vistula River** in Małopolska Province, the city dates back to **the 7th century**.
- Cracow was the official capital of Poland until 1596 and has traditionally been one of **the leading centres** of Polish academic, economic, cultural and artistic life.
- Cited as one of Europe's most beautiful cities, its **Old Town** was declared **the first UNESCO World Heritage Site in the world**.



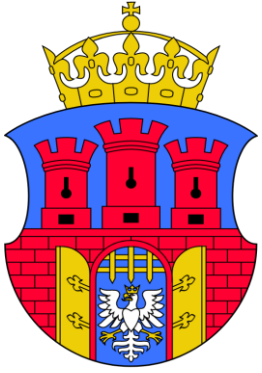


Cracow – things to see (1)

Old Town & Main Square

- The 13th-century merchants' Old Town is **one of the most famous old districts** in Poland today.
- The district features the centrally located Main Square, **the largest medieval town square of any European city**.
- There is **a number of historic landmarks** in its vicinity, such as St. Mary's Basilica, Church of St. Wojciech, Church of St. Barbara, as well as other national treasures.
- At the center of the square, surrounded by row houses and noble residences, stands **the Renaissance cloth hall Sukiennice** with the National Gallery of Art upstairs.



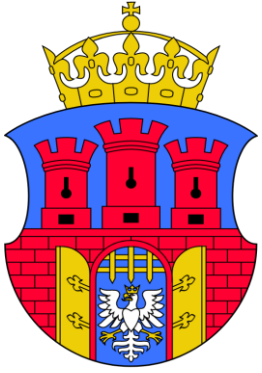


Cracow – things to see (2)

Wawel Royal Castle

- The Wawel Royal Castle was built in **13th and 14th centuries**.
- The castle, being one of the largest in Poland, represents nearly **all European architectural styles** of medieval, renaissance and baroque periods.
- It consists of **a number of structures** around the Italian-styled main courtyard.

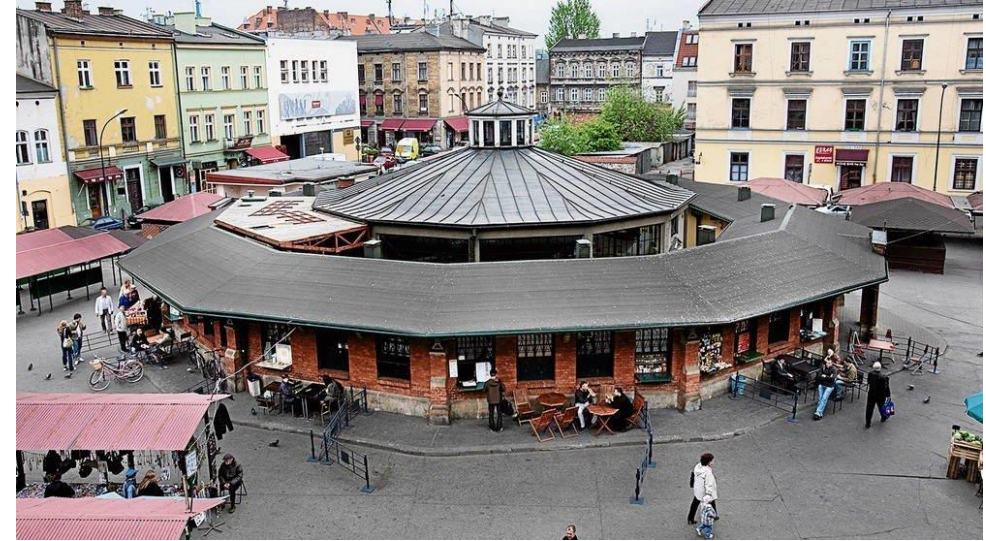




Cracow – things to see (3)

Jewish Kazimierz

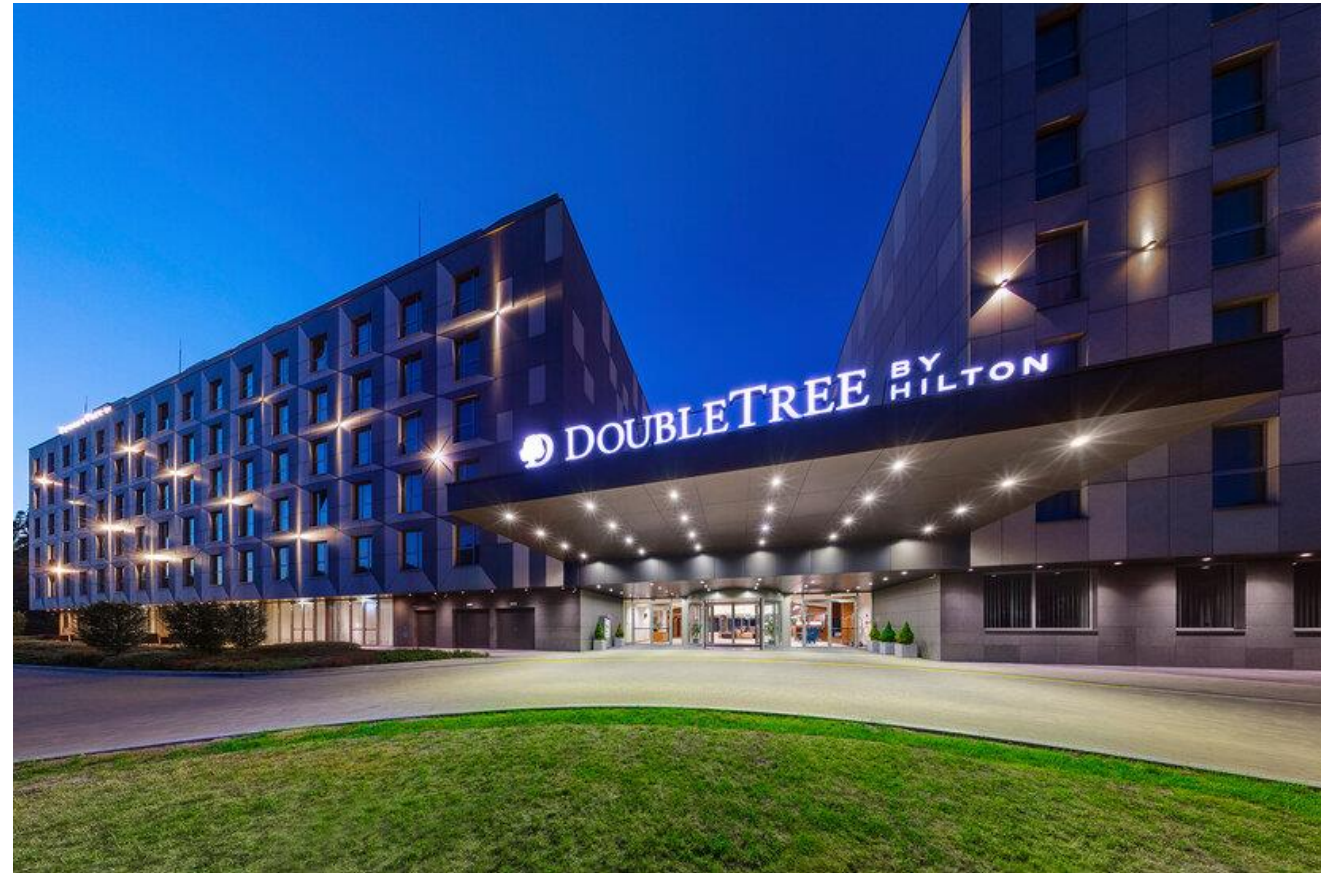
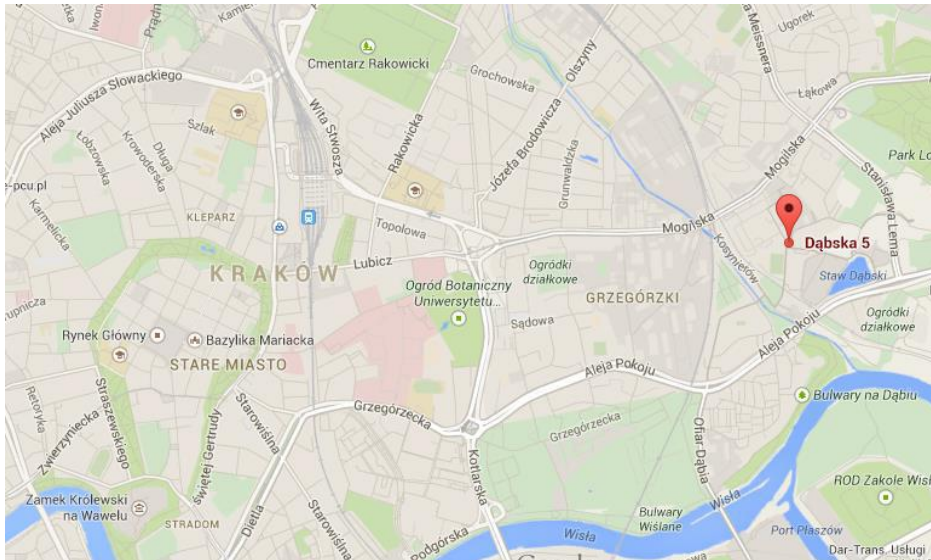
- Kazimierz (Yiddish: קאזמיר) is a **historical district of Cracow**.
- For many centuries, Kazimierz was a place of coexistence and intermingling of **ethnic Polish and Jewish cultures**.
- Today Kazimierz is one of **the major tourist attractions of Cracow** and an important center of cultural life of the city.

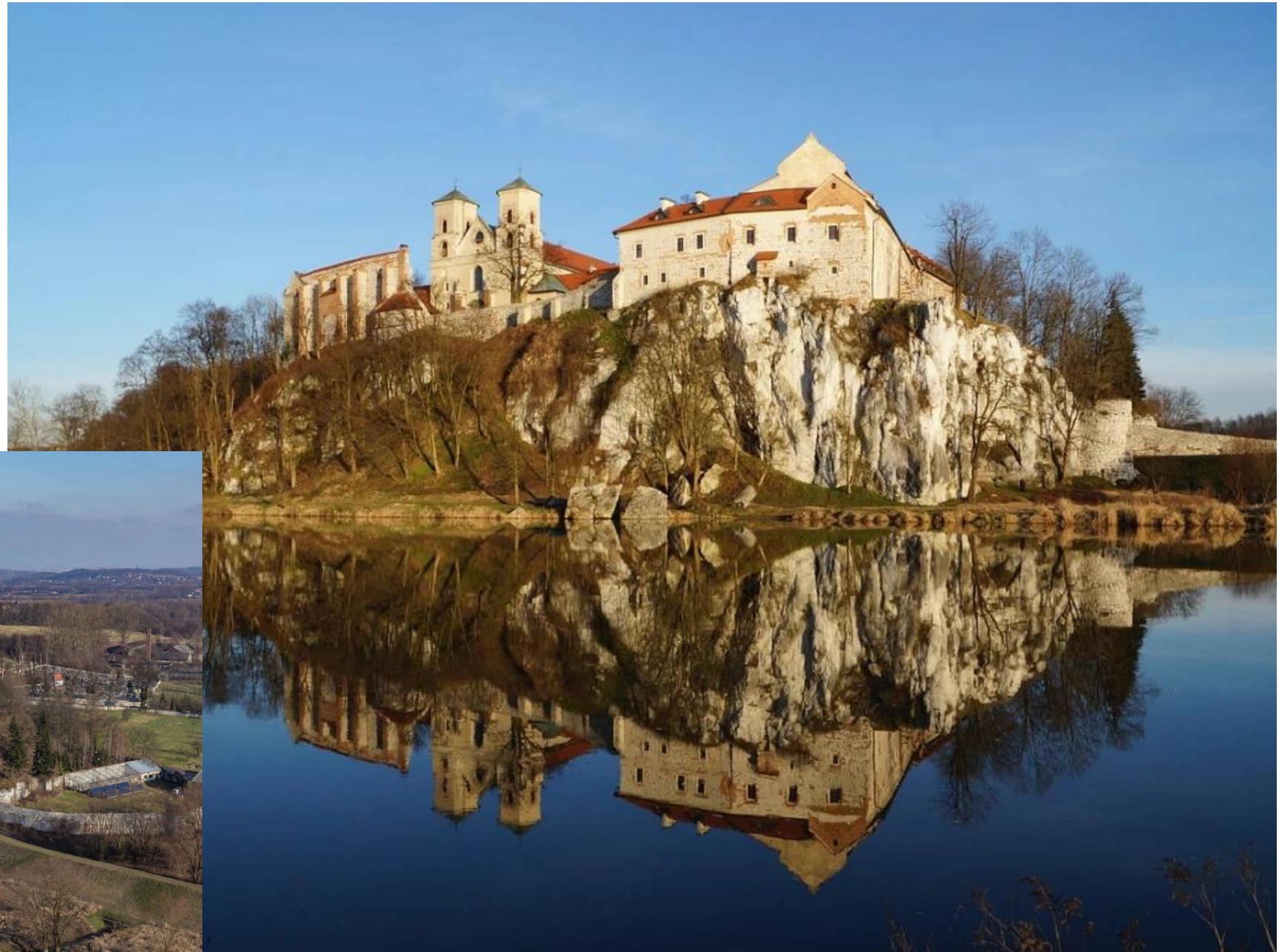

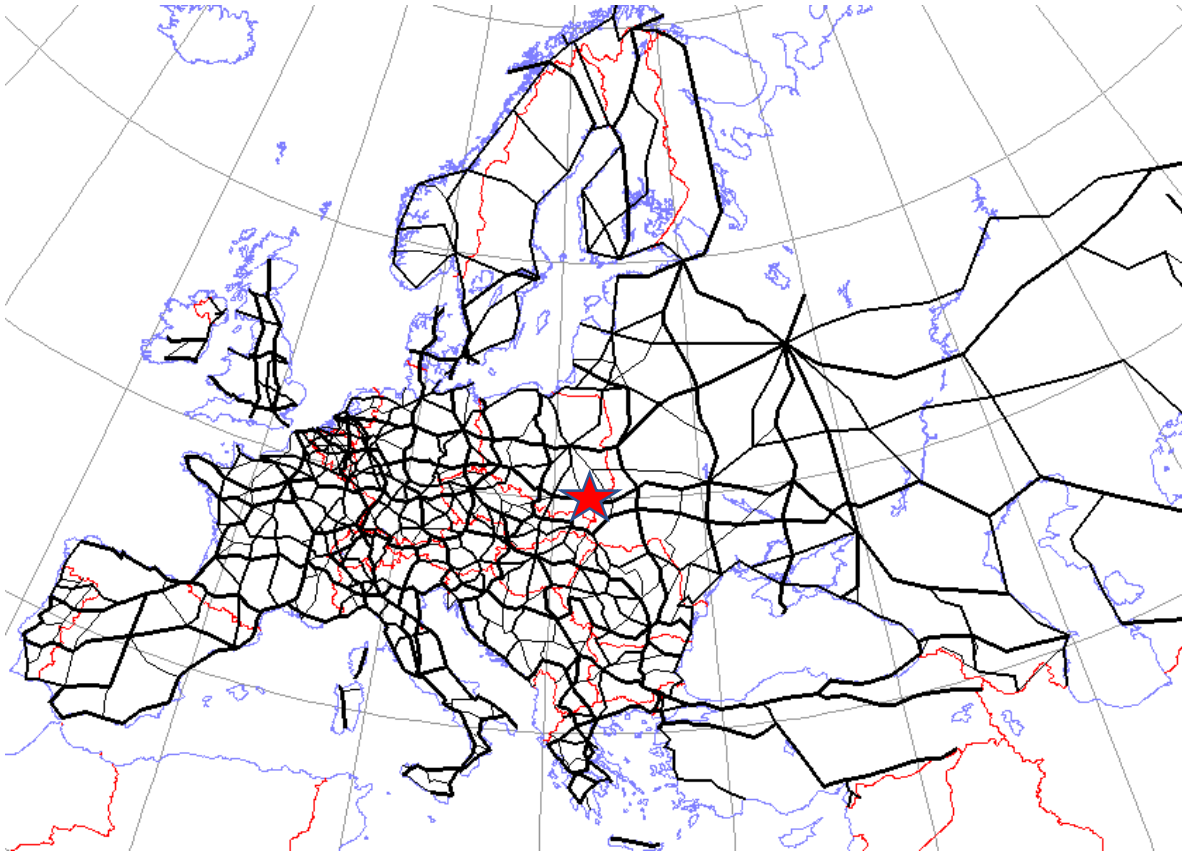

Getting to Cracow: by train

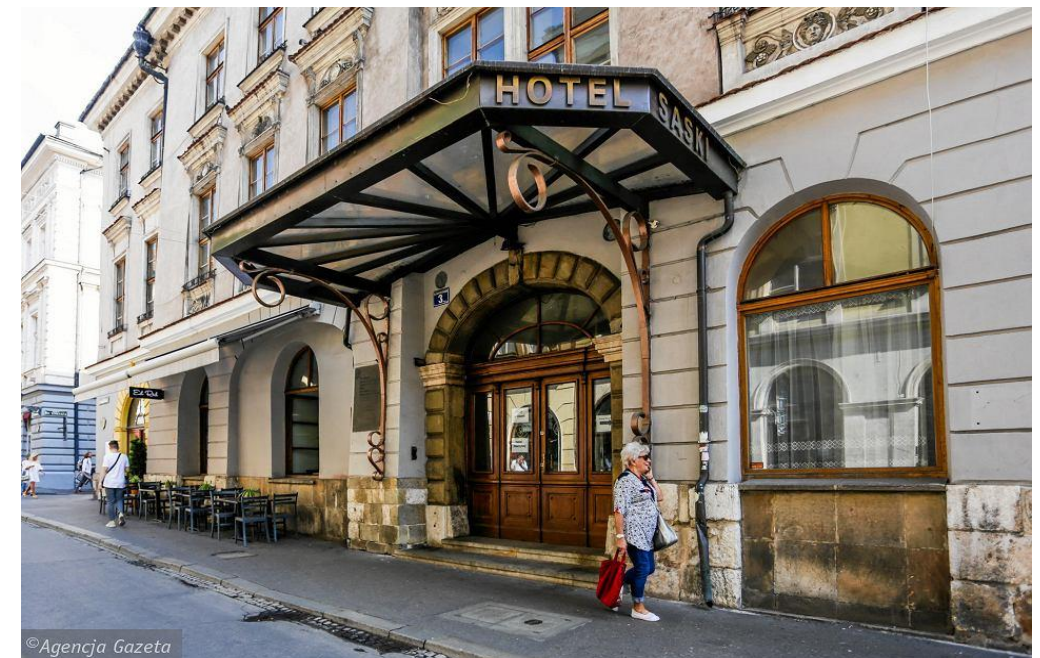


Getting to Cracow: by car



Cracow: Accommodation

- Cracow has great hotels in **all budget classes**.
- For historical splendor, you should pick one of **the Old Town locations**, although this comes with a price tag.
- The central Cracow is very compact and many of the key attractions will be walkable from any hotel in or surrounding the Old Town.
- Meanwhile, **Kazimierz has a special atmosphere** all of its own.
- If budget is a factor, the areas immediately outside the Old Town can be a good compromise.
