
Cracow University of Technology Patron of the university

- Tadeusz Kościuszko (1746 –1817)
- The Polish military engineer, statesman, and military leader who became a national hero in Poland and the United States
- He fought in the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth's struggles against Russia and Prussia, and on the US side in the American Revolutionary War
- A close friend of Thomas Jefferson's, with whom he shared ideals of human rights
- As Supreme Commander of the Polish National Armed Forces, he led the 1794 Kościuszko Uprising

- Cracow University of Technology (CUT) has been training engineering staff for more than seventy years.
- Current educational offer of CUT includes 29 majors of undergraduate and graduate programmes, which are conducted at 7 faculties of the university.
- Currently nearly 14,000 students taking full-time, part-time and Ph.D. studies as well as post-graduate studies with nearly 1,100 academic teachers overseeing their education.



- Ignacy Łukasiewicz (1822 –1882)
- The Polish pharmacist, engineer, businessman, inventor and philanthropist
- He was a pioneer who in 1856 built the world's first modern oil refinery
- His achievements included:
 - the invention of the modern kerosene lamp (1853),
 - the introduction of the first modern street lamp in Europe (1853),
 - the construction of the world's first modern oil well (1854).





About Cracow

- Cracow is the second-largest and one of the oldest cities in Poland.
- Situated on the Vistula River in Małopolska Province, the city dates back to the 7th century.
- Cracow was the official capital of Poland until 1596 and has traditionally been one of the leading centres of Polish academic, economic, cultural and artistic life.
- Cited as one of Europe's most beautiful cities, its Old Town was declared the first UNESCO World Heritage Site in the world.





Cracow – things to see (1)

Old Town & Main Square

- The 13th-century merchants' Old Town is **one of the most famous old districts** in Poland today.
- The district features the centrally located Main Square, the largest medieval town square of any European city.
- There is a number of historic landmarks in its vicinity, such as St. Mary's Basilica, Church of St. Wojciech, Church of St. Barbara, as well as other national treasures.
- At the center of the square, surrounded by row houses and noble residences, stands the Renaissance cloth hall Sukiennice with the National Gallery of Art upstairs.







Cracow – things to see (2) Wawel Royal Castle

- The Wawel Royal Castle was built in 13th and 14th centuries.
- The castle, being one of the largest in Poland, represents nearly all European architectural styles of medieval, renaissance and baroque periods.
- It consists of a number of structures around the Italian-styled main courtyard.









Cracow – things to see (3) Jewish Kazimierz

- Kazimierz (Yiddish: קוזמיר) is **a historical district of Cracow**.
- For many centuries, Kazimierz was a place of coexistence and intermingling of ethnic Polish and Jewish cultures.
- Today Kazimierz is one of **the major tourist attractions of Cracow** and an important center of cultural life of the city.









Cracow: Accommodation

- Cracow has great hotels in all budget classes.
- For historical splendor, you should pick one of **the Old Town locations**, although this comes with a price tag.
- The central Cracow is very compact and many of the key attractions will be walkable from any hotel in or surrounding the Old Town.
- Meanwhile, Kazimierz has a special atmosphere all of its own.
- If budget is a factor, the areas immediately outside the Old Town can be a good compromise.
